## Review and Approve 27-28 Jan Meeting Minutes

The minutes for the January 27-28, 2005 meeting were approved with no dissensions.

## Open Seat

The Nominations Committee composition was approved. The Nominations Committee for the current open seat on the Architecture Council is as follows:

The Call for Candidates Material (revised letter, guidelines for submitting candidacies, and web announcement) was discussed. The general consensus emerged that the highest priority should go toward finding someone with experience in markets and regulatory knowledge next.

*Actions:*

*Mia Bosquet and Steve Widergren are to launch call for candidates after reflecting latest changes in material.*

*Members are to review the Call for Candidate target distribution list and provide input. Members may forward the Call for Candidates as desired, informing Mia Bosquet and Steve Widergren.*

## Constitution Discussion

Rik Drummond updated the members on the progress: an initial test interview was successfully completed and a second is scheduled. Members suggested that a certain number of interviews should be held at upcoming forums and meetings where GWAC members will be present (BuilConn and the OEEA workshop in Atlanta, April 19 & 20, 2005). Based on prioritization of the list of target interviews and interviews carried out in these forums, the aim is to complete approximately 20 interviews before May 2005.

*Actions:*

*Rik Drummond is to lead second test interview with Albert Esser.*

*Mia Bosquet is to assemble feedback from test interviews and produce the Constitution Statements of Principle and Interview Form version 1.0, ready for the first round of interviews.*

*Jack McGowan is to suggest names and help set up interviews to be done during BuilConn. Steve Widergren is to suggest names and help set up interviews during the OEEA April workshop.*

All members are to review and provide feedback to refine and prioritize the list of people to be interviewed (with the aims of interviewing key people from a coherent balance of sectors).

Rik Drummond will conduct a number of interviews by conference call in the coming weeks to permit members to listen in and become familiar with the interview process.

## Illustrative Scenario

Jack McGowan presented an update of the progress made on Illustrative Scenarios. A new version of the market opportunity scenario is available that incorporates formatting comments from the San Diego meeting. This needs further review and refinement and a couple more scenarios are to be drafted.

*Action: The Illustrative Scenario Working Group is to meet by WebEx to discuss the template for scenarios, how they may be used, and proceeding with additional illustrative scenarios. The tentative date for this meeting is March 29, 2005, 1pm Pacific time (in combination with a meeting of the Elevator Story Working Group).*

## Elevator Story Update

Depending on the purpose or the mix of audiences, a number of the sentences suggested for the thirty second description of the GWAC could be appropriate. The key sentences should be assembled into a key message slide or two.

*Actions: Ron Ambrosio is to finish incorporating latest comments into the Elevator Story slides. The Elevator Story Working Group will meet, along with the Illustrative Scenario WG by WebEx on March 29, 2005 at 1pm Pacific time (date to be confirmed).*

*Prior to this meeting several versions of the 30 second story should be assembled for review and discussion.*

## Events & Activities

Erich Gunther, Rik Drummond, Dave Cohen, Eric Wong, and Larsh Johnson attended a CEC Demand Response Initiative workshop in Sacramento on 1 Feb 05. The CEC is proposing a "reference model" to help advanced metering companies and electric service providers collaborate on communications and control issues in support of demand response programs. Rik Drummond presented an overview of the GWAC. The following day a meeting of OpenAMI (an industry driven group) was convened to address the Commission's concerns and consider a reference design and potential interface standards. This will be monitored by the project and GWAC.

GWAC members McGowan, Drummond, Troxell, and Gunther will participate in the BuilConn Building Systems Energy Track on March 23-24, 2005 in Dallas. Rob Pratt will deliver a keynote address and participate in several panels.

Eric Lightner will be holding a peer review meeting for his Electric Distribution R&D work (which supports the GWAC). This is to take place in Atlanta on 19-20 Apr 05.

*Action: Steve Widergren is to speak with Eric Lightner regarding the participation of IntelliGrid at the OEEA Electric Distribution R&D Peer Review session in Atlanta.*

*Action: Jack McGowan will request input on an editorial article he is writing for Engineering Systems.*
